During this weekend in Salzburg you will be debating the question of tech monopolies and how to better encourage healthy competition and choice of product for consumers in the European Union. During this weekend, take the opportunity to learn about this and many other new topics, to connect with people from across the country and to learn new skills.

Monopolies lead to a lack of consumer choice especially in the digital sector, which often has a hyper-concentrated market of large platforms with a firm grip on customers and data, made worse by aggressive acquisitions policies, with large companies incorporating innovative start ups and pursuing monopolistic policies. As a member of the Committee on Internal Market and Consumer Protection you will be faced with debates on various related question. This file is supposed to help you with your research. Think about the following questions to help you with the structure of your preparatory work.

- 1. How can the European Union guarantee that the values of the **TFEU** (**Treaty of the functioning of the European Union**) are effectively enforced in the tech sector and to what extent can legislation around the **DMA** (**Digital Markets Act**) and **DSA** (**Digital Services Act**) be tightened to increase company responsibility rather than interfere in the free market?
- 2. How can we ensure that different government policy in regards to the enforcement of competition standards does not distort the competition in the European market?
- 3. How can the EU ensure a better anti-trust enforcement to protect market, small competitors, and consumers over the long run?
- 4. How can the European Union further protect consumers and tech companies alike from unfair competition by multi-billion corporations without breaching free market laws?

Use the sources provided below to gain a thorough understanding of our committee issue and get clear on your viewpoint and ideas for possible solutions – your insights will be key to a successful resolution!
